## REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- Completed application form
- Regulations for exchange students, signed by the applicant
- Consent form
- Letter of application (Motivation letter)
- Resume/CV
- Transcript (Master's students must also submit their Bachelor's degree transcript)
- English Proficiency Test score (TOEFL, IELTS, or equivalent), or a letter confirming the applicant's English proficiency.
- Recommendation letter from an academic advisor
- A copy of passport

## COURSE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

All students will receive the course schedule at least 2 weeks before the semester begins. Once they receive the course schedule, they can design their course schedule before arrival.

## ADD&DROP PERIODS

Add and drop Period is within the first two weeks after semester starts.

## NUMBER OF REQUIRED CREDITS

At least 9 credits (3 courses) but not more than 22 credits

## NUMBER OF CREDITS PER COURSE

2-3 credits, depending on the course.

# ARRIVAL GUIDELINES

## ACCOMMODATION

Exchange students accepted at SIIT should notify the institute of their arrival date at least one month in advance to facilitate dormitory reservations close to campus.

## VISA REQUIREMENTS/LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

The SIIT International Affairs and Corporate Relations Division will forward the acceptance letter to the student's home university. This letter, along with other necessary documents, must be presented at the Embassy to apply for a Non-Immigrant Visa "ED" (Student Visa).

## ORIENTATION SESSION

Scheduled one week before the semester begins, attendance at this session is mandatory for all exchange students to receive vital information regarding their stay and studies at SIIT.

## RECOMMENDED ARRIVAL DATE

Students are advised to arrive at least one week before the semester starts to settle in and attend the orientation session.

## HEALTH INSURANCE

Exchange students must secure health insurance covering medical expenses in Thailand prior to departure. Additionally, group accident and health insurance options are available at SIIT upon arrival.

## REGULATIONS

## COST OF LIVING

Estimate cost of living at SIIT (Approximately)

- Housing: 5,000 – 12,000 Baht/month
- Meal: 100-150 Baht/day  
3,000-4,500 Baht/month

- Travel cost  
(from the campus to Bangkok):
  - Taxi 300 - 500 Baht
  - Minivan 30-50 Baht
  - Bus 10-45 Baht

Students should budget for at least 15,000 Baht/month to cover living expenses.



# SUPPORTS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

## **DORMITORY RESERVATION**

The SIIT International Affairs and Corporate Relations Division assists exchange students by providing a list of off-campus accommodations and may also help in reserving dormitories for them.

## **AIRPORT PICK UP SERVICE**

Exchange students can avail of transportation services for airport pick-ups, available during working hours, for arrivals two weeks before orientation week.

## **WELCOME WEEK**

A 3 to 4-day welcome week is organized for exchange students, which includes orientation day, a campus tour, and a Thai study day, ensuring a warm introduction to SIIT and Thai culture.

## **BUDDY SYSTEM**

Each exchange student is paired with at least one SIIT student. The buddy helps with various arrival needs such as airport pick-up, dormitory check-in, shopping, and campus tours.

## **FREE ACCESS UNIVERSITY'S FACILITIES**

Exchange students enjoy free access to various university facilities, including a gym, swimming pool, badminton court, and tennis court.

## **VISA EXTENSION**

The SIIT International Affairs and Corporate Relations Division provides support with documentation for visa extensions and other visa-related matters during the exchange students' stay.

## **BASIC THAI LANGUAGE COURSE**

SIIT offers a free Basic Thai Language course for international students, culminating in a certificate of completion to students who successfully complete the course.

## **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**

Each semester, SIIT arranges cultural activities for international students, such as cultural trips, Thai Cooking Day, and International Night, to immerse students in the rich Thai culture.
